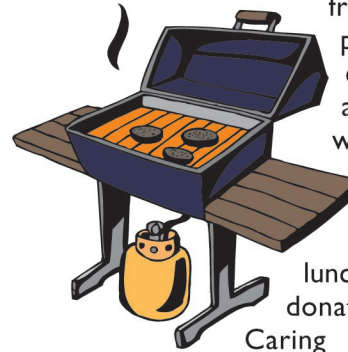
## GROCERY RECEIPT CORRECTION
